Located in the heart of the Inland Empire, the Loma Linda University School of Nursing offers students a quality Christian education embracing the importance of whole person care for mind, body, and spirit. ## PROGRAM INFORMATION

The BS to PhD degree in nursing prepares nurse scholars, leaders, and faculty to engage in knowledge development and research relevant to nursing science and practice. Offered full-time or part-time on the LLU campus, it uses distance learning strategies with courses taken during the academic year through a “hybrid” model. Students complete online courses and attend one-week, on-campus sessions each quarter, scheduled well in advance. Those interested in Vulnerable Populations/ Health Disparities, Health/Wellness/Wholeness, and Health Systems will find strong faculty mentors. Core courses, electives, and research methods are available on campus, with specialty courses offered through the \*NEXus partnership or other universities (some transfer limits apply). After completing coursework, students take an oral comprehensive exam before starting the dissertation. Designed for adult learners, the program can be completed in 5 years full-time or 7 years part-time.

\*NEXus (Nursing Education Xchange) is a partnership among select Western Institute of Nursing institutions to facilitate enrollment in doctoral courses not available on your home campus. ## LOMA LINDA UNIVERSITY MEDICAL CENTER (LLUMC)

LLUMC is located across the street from the School of Nursing. The Medical Center is a tertiary-care teaching hospital with over 1,000 beds across multiple entities: LLUMC, Children's Hospital, East Campus, Behavioral Medicine Center, Surgical Hospital and LLUMC - Murrieta. As a level one regional trauma and health care center, LLUMC operates some of the largest clinical programs in the United States.

LLUMC is the site for many of the clinical experiences, internships, and educational opportunities available to students at Loma Linda University.

### ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Baccalaureate degree in nursing from a regionally accredited program
- GPA of 3.3 or higher for all undergraduate coursework
- License to practice nursing in state of residence
- Application (NursingCAS & secondary)
- Three electronic recommendations (recommenders will receive an e-mail once application is submitted)
- Official transcripts from all colleges attended
- Health Science reasoning test (online)
- Evidence of scholarly work (submitted at time of interview)
- Select applicants will be invited to interview

### ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

International applicants (non-U.S. citizens and non-U.S. permanent residents) must meet all admission requirements for the chosen program. In addition, official international transcripts must be evaluated by an accredited evaluation service. The application process must be initiated in a timely manner in order to comply with national immigration policies. A TOEFL score may also be required.

## TRANSCRIPTS

You must submit transcripts from all post-secondary institutions that you have attended, regardless of whether or not it applies to your prerequisite coursework. This includes all colleges, universities, military credit, Advanced Placement, CLEP, and unaccredited schools. **Official transcripts must be sent by the issuing institution(s) directly to NursingCAS for verification.** Transcripts provided in any other manner are considered unofficial.

## FINANCIAL AID
