Located in the heart of the Inland Empire, the Loma Linda University School of Nursing offers students a quality Christian education embracing the importance of whole person care for mind, body, and spirit. ## PROGRAM INFORMATION

The MS to PhD in nursing prepares scholars, leaders, and faculty for research and knowledge development in nursing science and practice. Offered full-time or part-time on the LLU campus, the program uses distance learning strategies, with courses during the academic year delivered in a hybrid format. Students complete online coursework and attend one-week, on-campus intensive sessions each quarter, scheduled well in advance for planning. Areas of focus include Vulnerable Populations/Health Disparities, Health/Wellness/ Wholeness, and Health Systems, with faculty mentors available for dissertation support. Core, elective, and research courses are offered at LLU, while specialty courses may be taken through the \*NEXus partnership or other universities (subject to transfer unit limits). The program accommodates adult learners and can be completed in 4 years full-time or 7 years part-time.

\*NEXus (Nursing Education Xchange) is a partnership among select Western Institute of Nursing institutions to facilitate enrollment in doctoral courses not available on your home campus. Through NEXus, the institutions have identified courses that are available at a distance and open for enrollments from partner institutions.

## LOMA LINDA UNIVERSITY MEDICAL CENTER (LLUMC)

LLUMC is located across the street from the School of Nursing. The Medical Center is a tertiary-care teaching hospital with over 1,000 beds across multiple entities: LLUMC, Children's Hospital, East Campus, Behavioral Medicine Center, Surgical Hospital and LLUMC - Murrieta. As a level one regional trauma and health care center, LLUMC operates some of the largest clinical programs in the United States.

LLUMC is the site for many of the clinical experiences, internships, and educational opportunities available to students at Loma Linda University.

## **ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS**

- Master's nursing degree from a regionally accredited program
- Preference will be given to applicants with a Master's degree in nursing (if MS is not in nursing, BS must be in nursing)
- GPA of 3.3 or higher for all graduate coursework
- License to practice nursing in state of residence
- Application (NursingCAS & secondary)
- Three electronic recommendations (recommenders will receive an e-mail once application is submitted)
- Official transcripts from all colleges attended
- Evidence of scholarly work (submitted at time of interview)
- Select applicants will be invited to interview

## ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

International applicants (non-U.S. citizens and non-U.S. permanent residents) must meet all admission requirements for the chosen program. In addition, official international transcripts must be evaluated by an accredited evaluation service. The application process must be initiated in a timely manner in order to comply with national immigration policies. A TOEFL score may also be required.

## **TRANSCRIPTS**

You must submit transcripts from all post-secondary institutions that you have attended, regardless of whether or not it applies to your prerequisite coursework. This includes all colleges, universities, military credit, Advanced Placement, CLEP, and unaccredited schools. Official transcripts must be sent by the issuing institution(s) directly to NursingCAS for verification. Transcripts provided in any other manner are considered unofficial.

## **FINANCIAL AID**

Financial aid is available for eligible students. Begin early even before formal acceptance into the Nursing Program. For current financial aid info, scan the OR code.
