Located in the heart of the Inland Empire, the Loma Linda University School of Nursing offers students a quality Christian education embracing the importance of whole person care for mind, body and spirit. With students from more than 80 countries and 65 religions, we have a richly diverse student body that adds to the excitement of learning and exchange of ideas. Our commitment to the development of expert nurse clinicians, educators, administrators, and researchers prepares graduates to leave with a solid foundation, inspired to serve and transform the world one person at a time.

All programs are fully accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC); the MS programs are also accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE).

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

- Full-time and part-time options available - 3 years
- Hyflex Core Courses—up to 2 days on campus per quarter
- The Hyflex core courses are primarily on-line with 1 to 2 course meetings on campus in week 5 of each quarter.
- Concentration courses and clinical courses meet once a week in person

Masters of Science in Nursing (MS) trained nurses are in high demand as nurse managers, clinical educators, health policy consultants, research assistants, and public health nurses. The LLUSN MS in Nursing prepares students to assume these leadership roles in a variety of organizational settings. Students who seek to further their careers, may pursue either a PhD in Nursing or a Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP).

MS OPTIONS:

Nursing Administration (NA): The NA program at LLU School of Nursing prepares students for important leadership roles in healthcare. Nurse Administrators can run a small team of nurses or an entire health system. They also have the opportunity to manage work flow and create policies.

The curriculum draws from the practice of nursing, management, and related fields. It also includes administrative, research and clinical components. An intensive practicum provides the opportunity to develop and test skills in real-life settings with emphasis on critical thinking.

Graduates are prepared for certification by the American Association as a Nurse Executive, Advanced.

Nurse Educator (NE): The NE program at LLU School of Nursing prepares nurses for the pivotal role of educating future nurses in the classroom and practice setting. Nurse educators are critical players in providing quality educational experiences that prepare nursing students for a diverse workforce experience.

The teaching-learning strand within the curriculum focuses on developing the skills necessary for a teaching role in nursing. The NE program allows students to select a focus in which to conduct clinical research and prepare for a career in teaching. Educator's can work in a variety of settings, including hospitals, nursing schools, public health agencies and more.

Graduates will be encouraged to obtain certification in their clinical area as part of the evidence of clinical expertise for the faculty role.

- Nurse Educator - Obstetrics & Pediatrics

LOMA LINDA UNIVERSITY MEDICAL CENTER (LLUMC)

LLUMC is located across the street from the School of Nursing. The Medical Center is a tertiary-care teaching hospital with over 1,000 beds across multiple entities: LLUMC, Children's Hospital, East Campus, Behavioral Medicine Center, Surgical Hospital and LLUMC - Murrieta. As a level one regional trauma and health care center, LLUMC operates some of the largest clinical programs in the United States.

LLUMC is the site for many of the clinical experiences, internships, and educational opportunities available to students at Loma Linda University.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Baccalaureate degree in nursing from a regionally accredited program
- GPA of 3.0, both cumulative and in nursing courses
- Hold a current U.S. RN license (California RN license is required before the start of classes)
- One year of RN experience in the area of desired clinical concentration is strongly advised for application competitiveness
- Application (NursingCAS & secondary)
- Three electronic recommendations (recommenders will receive an e-mail once application is submitted)
- Official transcripts from all colleges attended
- Select applicants will be invited to interview

APPLICATION INFORMATION

To apply to Loma Linda University's School of Nursing, students must first meet all the admission requirements. There is a \$70 non-refundable application fee. The application can be found online at www.llu.edu/apply.

ADMISSION DEADLINES

The School of Nursing accepts MS students in the Autumn, Winter and Spring Quarters. All admission requirements must be completed by the deadline. Deadlines are as follows:

- **AUTUMN – April 1** (quarter begins in September)
- **WINTER – August 1** (quarter begins in January)
- **SPRING – November 1** (quarter begins in March)

This includes all colleges, universities, military credit, Advanced Placement, CLEP, and unaccredited schools. *Official transcripts must be sent by the issuing institution(s) directly to NursingCAS for verification.* Transcripts provided in any other manner are considered unofficial.
