ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Minimum 2.5 GPA (cumulative & prerequisite)
- Application (NursingCAS & secondary)
- Official Transcripts from all colleges attended
- **■** Three Recommendations
- **Interview** (by invitation)

TRANSCRIPTS

You must submit transcripts from all post-secondary institutions that you have attended, regardless of whether or not it applies to your prerequisite coursework. This includes all colleges, universities, military credit, Advanced Placement, CLEP, and unaccredited schools. Official transcripts must be sent by the issuing institution(s) directly to NursingCAS for verification. Transcripts provided in any other manner are considered unofficial.

FINANCIAL AID

Financial aid is available for eligible students. Begin early, even before formal acceptance into the Nursing program. For current financial aid info, scan the QR.



HOUSING & DINING

Housing is available on campus in a limited capacity in different residence halls. Students under 21 must live on campus, unless they are married or living with their parents. Scan QR for more housing and dining information.
