PROGRAM INFORMATION

The BS to PhD degree in nursing is designed to prepare nurse scholars, leaders, and faculty who are ready to engage in knowledge development and research relevant to nursing science and practice.

The BS to PhD is offered as a full-time or part-time program on the LLU campus utilizing distance learning strategies. Courses are taken during the academic year, using a "hybrid" or "blended" teaching model. Students work their courses on-line and are required to come to campus for a one-week intensive face-to-face session each quarter. Seminar week schedules are developed well in advance so students can plan accordingly. Students interested in developing knowledge in the areas of Vulnerable Populations/Health Disparities, Health/Wellness/Wholeness, and Health Systems will find strong faculty mentors for their dissertation interest. Core courses, Concentration/Electives to support the student's dissertation interest, research methods and cognates are available on the LLU campus. Specialty courses may be taken, through the *NEXus partnership (not subject to transfer unit limitations), or at another university (a limited number of units may be transferred if the school is not part of NEXus).

Once core courses, concentration/electives and cognates are complete, the student is eligible to take their oral comprehensive exam after which, the students moves forward to complete the dissertation.

This schedule is designed to accommodate the needs of adult learners. The program may be completed in 4 years full-time or 7 years part-time.

*NEXus (Nursing Education Xchange) is a partnership among select Western Institute of Nursing institutions to facilitate enrollment in doctoral courses not available on your home campus. Through NEXus, the institutions have identified courses that are available at a distance and open for enrollments from partner institutions.

LOMA LINDA UNIVERSITY MEDICAL CENTER (LLUMC)

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Baccalaureate degree in nursing from a regionally accredited program
- GPA of 3.3 or higher for all undergraduate coursework
- License to practice nursing in state of residence
- Application with personal statement
- Three electronic recommendations
(recommenders will receive an e-mail once application is submitted)
- Official transcripts from all colleges attended
- Select applicants will be invited to interview
- Evidence of scholarly work (submitted at time of interview)

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

International applicants (non-U.S. citizens and non-U.S. permanent residents) must meet all admission requirements for the chosen program. In addition, official international transcripts must be evaluated by an accredited evaluation service. The application process must be initiated in a timely manner in order to comply with national immigration policies. A TOEFL score may also be required.
