Twenty-eight students from 9 different countries met at Asia-Pacific International University in Thailand for their second summer intensive in Loma Linda University's off campus masters program. The program is four years in length and students study subjects all during the year. The group is at the half-way mark as of the end of July. Gamma Alpha members Danilyn Angeles, Ellen D'Errico, Edelweiss Ramal and Delores Wright traveled to Thailand this summer conducting two-weeks each of intensive classroom instruction. Classes taught were Nursing Leadership, Teaching/Learning Theory, Health Policy, and Pathophysiology. Students represented their countries well as they "soaked up" nursing knowledge. Students hailed from Cambodia, China, Haiti, Solomon Islands, Napal, Thailand, Nigeria, Kenya, and Jamaica. When these students graduate with their masters degree in nursing education, they will have the opportunity to take leadership roles in their home country organizations (hospitals and schools of nursing). The students are also building a collegial network of friends for life. All of the students were told about the benefits of belonging to STTI. We hope to have several new candidates from this group very soon!
